St. Albert Public Library has much to be proud of in 2021. Our focus was on looking ahead; our 2021-22 strategic plan was built around personal and economic recovery goals that impact individuals, families, and the larger community, and Library staff spent the year working to

make these goals a reality. The public library plays a vital role for St. Albertans of all ages and walks of life, building community connections, access to opportunities, and supports for individuals and the collective good.

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Library staff showed innovation and kindness in continuing to meet the evolving needs of the community in a difficult year.

2021 was about community recovery

Our mission to serve all St. Albertans makes the Library uniquely positioned to support the community in its recovery from the pandemic. We focused on helping St. Albertans in their lifelong learning, economic recovery, and personal recovery. Libraries are also places of enthusiasm and possibility, and we provided points of connection and joy for citizens through a difficult year.

The Library reached into the community in new and innovative ways. Our focus was on: students and educators; families; seniors; isolated individuals; job seekers; business owners; and marginalized communities. We brought people back into the library spaces they love in thoughtful, safe and creative ways.

The Library builds community

It was exciting to return to in-person services in 2021. In September we led the region in the return to safe in-person storytimes and afterschool programs at both Library locations when Provincial orders made that possible. We're proud of all the online programs we delivered to ensure people stayed connected when they couldn't come together. But people needed to gather in person, and our key focus was on bringing community together in Library spaces.

The Outreach Team offered year-round outdoor programs in addition to popular storytimes at the Lacombe Community Garden and in the Garden Crescent green space. Staff created popular craft and STEAM education kits that children and teens could pick up at both Library locations.



Spooky Trail Tale

On a cool wintry night at the end of October, 430 people came together in the woods behind the Downtown Library to enjoy a Spooky Trail Tale in English and French, then enjoy hot chocolate afterward.

The Library is for everyone

Vulnerable populations were top of mind in our recovery plans. Most programming and services offered to vulnerable St. Albertans pre-COVID were reinstated in 2021, with some expansions:

- Deliveries to seniors' homes and homebound St. Albertans;
- Programming with Outloud St. Albert;
- In-person supports for newcomers to Canada.

The St. Albert Library is doing an amazing job at diversity in their programming that allows for so many voices of the community. I am so impressed and looking forward to seeing more.

Summer Reading Game

In pandemic times, literacy supports are more important than ever. Participants played the SRG online, in both Library locations, and at a pop-up tent in the park.

Supports for Educators and Parents

The Library supported students, teachers and parents with: the Educators Newsletter; Trail Tale loans; Earth Day and Arbor Day seed packs and activities; school break programs; and free tutoring for students through our partnership with Discover Prep. The Outreach Team connected with 607 children during 31 visits to preschools and daycares.

Reading Buddies mentorship program

Reading Buddies pairs struggling readers with teen mentors. In 2021, 43 teens volunteered an incredible 372 hours to help 65 struggling readers. Their little buddies read for 251 hours!

The Library helped people find jobs


I really truly appreciate this ... Been down in the dumps since losing my job, and hearing that I'm not alone made me feel a lot better, thank you.


In 2021, the Library helped people to get jobs and learn new skill sets. We shared resources with job creators and local businesses, and worked with new and existing partners to broaden the reach of the Career Resource Centre (CRC).

Free CRC supports:

- Résumé Tutor Service offers résumé and job search help
- Professional and skills development via LinkedIn Learning
- Career workshops
- Dedicated work search computers
- Free printing of résumés, cover letters and job postings
- Laptops, webcams and headsets for interviews and training
- Print, eBook and audiobooks on career and job search topics
- Support from knowledgeable Library staff

The Library was everywhere

Our award-winning Outreach Team delivered pop-up library services in parks and neighbourhoods, offering on-the-spot library memberships and material loans. Trail and Stroller Tales in parks and along trails promoted active literacy. Adults love the Trail Tales as much as children do!

We just did the scavenger hunt today and had to let you know that we thoroughly enjoyed this! This was so fun and funny and just perfect for my young children. Thank you so much!

Year-round scavenger hunts and self-directed Forest Friends programs in the woods behind the Downtown Library received great feedback from families needing to get out of the house for safe, fun activities. Library staff used a donated Book Bike to take library services deeper into the trail system.

Jensen Lakes Library came into its own in 2021

We are loving the Jensen Lakes Library. It is so easy to get out of the car and just walk in the door without having to wrangle the kids across the busy road. And the staff are so helpful!

This small but mighty library location with a staff of three has steadily worked its way into the hearts of the community despite its challenging start, opening only six weeks before the pandemic changed everything in 2020. Residents of north St. Albert and beyond have embraced Jensen Lakes Library (JLL) for its ease of access to all library collections, the Spring Break and Summer Reading Games, quiet study spaces, and continued Curbside Pickup service.

In September, JLL staff began offering weekly in-person storytimes and three afterschool programs each month. The popular afterschool programs fill up fast with waiting lists.


