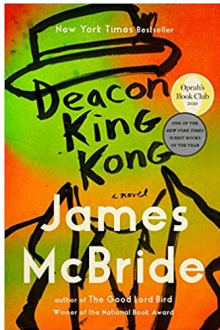

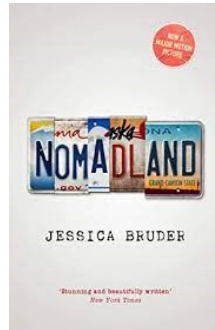

The funny, surprising story of the shooting of a Brooklyn drug dealer by a fumbling, cranky church deacon in 1969 and the people who witnessed it.

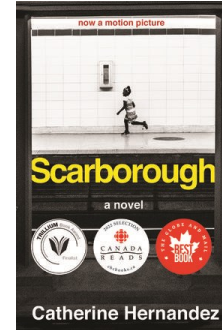
